## WEEKLY SUMMARY ALERT

The following section illustrates the date alerts were reported from 19th - 23rd Sept, 2022.

**ALERTS DATE: 19th September, 2022**

### ARMED ROBBERY

- The Lagos State Police Command has arrested a 39-year-old robbery suspect and recovered a gun from him in the state's Lekki Free Trade Zone. According to a spokesperson for the command, the police received information that some hoodlums vandalize cables and steel iron rods at the Dangote Refinery construction site, using a canoe to transport the cables to Epe and its environs. The command's spokesperson confirmed in a statement issued on Friday in Lagos that the suspect was apprehended on September 15 following a tip-off.
- An angry mob assassinated a notorious handset snatcher in Warri's Iyara community, Warri South Local Government Area, Delta State. The phone snatcher, who was said to be a member of a gang of hoodlums who specialized in robbing their victims of valuables, was apprehended as he attacked a young girl at the popular Akara Junction in the area.
- An alleged notorious armed robber terrorizing members of the Abagana community and its environs has been apprehended by Abagana community vigilantes in Njikoka Local Government Area of Anambra State. The suspect was apprehended by vigilantes over the weekend.

### ARMS & AMMUNITION

- On Saturday, September 17, 2022, National Drug Law Enforcement Agency (NDLEA) agents on patrol along the Okene-Abuja highway intercepted a J-5 bus carrying 18 pump action rifles and 1,300 cartridges in Kogi State. The vehicle was on its way from Onitsha, Anambra State, to Kaduna-Zaria, Kaduna State. The anti-narcotics agency said two suspects carrying arms and ammunition were arrested.

### BANDITRY

- Bandits killed one person and kidnapped three farmers in Kaduna State's Kurgin Gabas community, Birnin Gwari local government area. This was revealed on Sunday by the chairman of Birnin Gwari Emirate Progressive Union (BEPU) in a statement made available to journalists in Kaduna. It was reported that the armed bandits kidnapped three locals at farms in Kurgin Gabas Community in the Western part of Birnin-Gwari Local Government Area of Kaduna State on Thursday 15th September, 2022. The bandits also invaded the same Community on Friday 16th, snatched a motorcycle and killed the owner instantly before fleeing into the forest.

### BOMBING

- Military airstrikes on the residence of a bandit warlord in the Zamfara forests resulted in numerous casualties. According to military sources, the airstrike killed scores of armed bandits loyal to the notorious bandit camp. According to a senior military officer, the bandits were killed in Zamfara State during a coordinated surprise attack by the air component of Operation Forest Sanity.

## WEEKLY SUMMARY ALERT

### CULTISM ATTACK

- Fear is palpable in Makurdi, the Benue State capital, as a result of an increase in clashes between rival cult groups and kidnappings in the state and its environs. Thirty suspects were arrested in Gboko town a fortnight ago in connection with a bloody rival cult clash that claimed three lives and injured several others in Benue State's Gboko Local Government Area, LGA.
- A student at Yaba College of Technology who has yet to be identified was shot dead by suspected cultists on campus. According to reports, the assailants shot and killed the student in the late hours of Thursday.

### FLOODING

- Residents of Kabala Coast, Kabala Doki, and Kigo Road in Kaduna-North, and Bashama Road in Tudun-Wada, Kaduna-South, called on the state and federal governments on Friday to come to their aid as the Kaduna River reportedly fills to capacity. The communities claim that a flood was imminent in the community due to the river overflowing its banks.
- Following a 16-hour torrential rain, a gully erosion in several communities in Bende Local Government Area of Abia State swallowed a two-story building and a four-bedroom bungalow. Amaewu, Umueze, Amamba, and Uzuakoli are among the communities affected. It was gathered that the rainfall lasted from Friday 4pm to Saturday 7am. As a result, the people of the area are now terrified of the gully erosion site, which has defied all solutions despite spending millions of Naira to address it.

### KIDNAPPING

- Men from the Cross River State Police Command's anti-cultism and kidnapping squad have killed two kidnappers. The state police commissioner confirmed the killing in Calabar. He claimed that the two had terrorized the locals for a long time before the squad smoked them out.
- Unknown gunmen kidnapped five commercial vehicle passengers along the East West Road's Emohua-Kalabari axis. The incident is said to have occurred around 8 p.m. on Saturday. The hoodlums intercepted the vehicle that was picking up passengers at the Choba junction and took them to an unknown destination. According to reports, the driver of the vehicle was released, but the other passengers had yet to be released.
- The Edo State Police Command has apprehended three suspected members of a kidnap gang that kidnapped and murdered a businessman after demanding a ransom from his relatives. The suspects led the command's Intelligence Rapid Response Squad to a forest in Ganaga, Kogi State, where the 34-year-old victim's remains were buried in a shallow grave. Surprisingly, one of the suspects, a laborer who worked with the deceased, was found to be the mastermind of the kidnapping.

## WEEKLY SUMMARY ALERT

### KIDNAPPING

- The Cross River State Police Command has apprehended two of the three suspects who abducted some pastors in the state's Odukpani Local Government Area in August 2022. According to reports, the pastors were on their way to Creek Town for a church planting ceremony when they were abducted on the waterways by the assailants, who were later paid N10 million as a ransom for their release. In Calabar, the state Commissioner of Police confirmed the development, saying the breakthrough was made by the Anti-Cultism and Kidnapping Squad, the Sting Unit, and Op Akpakwu, who carried out the covert operation based on credible intelligence.

### SHOOTING

- At midnight on Friday, the Islamic State of West African Province (ISWAP) fighters attacked its rival faction, the Jam'at Ahl as-Sunnah lid-Da'wah wa'l-Jihd known as Boko Haram terrorists, killing 29 fighters at the terrorists enclave in Bama local government area of Borno State. According to reports, an ISWAP terrorist column led by Ba'ana Chigori invaded Boko Haram positions in Gaizuwa, also known as Gabchari, Mantari, and Mallum Masari, in operations that began around 21:00 hours. According to an intelligence report obtained in Lake Chad, the attack sparked a fierce gunfight between the terror groups.

### SHOOTING (GUNMEN)

- The Bauchi State Police Command has confirmed that unknown gunmen attempted to assassinate the Senior Special Assistant (SSA) on Christian Religious Affairs to the Bauchi State Governor. The Police Command revealed that a group of unidentified gunmen, numbering about seven, attacked the Governor's aide's home in Birshi, a suburb of Bauchi.

### THEFT

- The Nigeria Security and Civil Defense Corps (NSCDC) Commandant for Delta State has paraded eight suspects in connection with crude oil theft and pipeline vandalism. In a statement issued on Sunday, the command's Public Relations Officer stated that the arrest was made as a result of the command's recently launched Special Tactical Team, codenamed Operation Show No Mercy To Crude Oil Thieves, Pipeline Vandals, Amongst Other Crimes and Criminalities in the State.

### HOODLUMS

- On Friday, the Commissioner of Police in Ebonyi State confirmed the arrest of some suspected hoodlums who allegedly attacked officers on patrol and set fire to their van at Nkomoro/Agba, a boundary between the state's Ezza North and Ishielu LGAs. The Commissioner stated this in a statement signed and issued to journalists in Abakaliki on Friday by the Police Public Relations Officer, PPRO.

### FLOODING

- As the nation enters the peak of the flooding season, the Nigeria Hydrological Services Agency (NIHSA) has tasked states and local government councils across the federation to intensify and step up efforts to avert flood-related disasters in their domains. In a statement issued on Friday, the Director General of NIHSA stated that the flooding situation remains as the Rivers Niger and Benue system continue to build up.

## **WEEKLY SUMMARY ALERT**

### **BOAT MISHAP**

- In another canoe mishap in Jigawa State's Auyo Local Government Area, two people were confirmed dead and four were rescued. A police spokesman confirmed the incident in a press release to journalists. The incident happened on Sunday morning while the canoe was carrying six passengers from Wailare village in Auyo Local Government, he said. According to him, two people died, while the remaining four passengers were saved.
- A boat capsized in Yobe State, killing at least two people and leaving many more missing. The incident occurred on Saturday afternoon when two passenger boats bound for the Babangida weekly market capsized in a flood wave, according to the Director-General Press and Media Affairs in Yobe.

### **RTA**

- On Sunday, a car accident along the Yangoli-Gwagwalada road in the Federal Capital Territory (FCT) killed 19 people and severely injured eight others. When the Acting Corps Marshal of the Federal Road Safety Corps (FRSC) visited the scene, he confirmed the incident.
- The Federal Road Safety Corps has confirmed that two people were killed and six others were injured in three separate car crashes that occurred on Friday along the Gombe bypass towards Pantami community. The FRSC's Gombe State Command Corps Commander stated that the suspected causes of the accidents, which involved one truck, one vehicle, and one motorcycle, were overloading, speeding, and faulty vehicles.

### **COMMUNAL VIOLENCE**

- Feudal leaders of Delta State's Aladja and Ogbe-Ijoh communities have signed a peace and security pact. This came as the Nigerian Army's Commanding Officer 3 Battalion in Effurun waded into the lingering boundary crisis. According to reports, the military's intervention in the bloody boundary dispute prompted the leaders of the two communities and other stakeholders to convene a peace conference on Saturday, September 17, 2022, at the Government House Annex in Edjeba, Warri metropolis.

### **EPIDEMIC**

- A cholera outbreak has killed at least two people at a facility where ex-Boko Haram fighters are being held in Maiduguri, the Borno State capital. The deaths at the Kosheri camp on the Maiduguri-Dikwa road were confirmed by the Borno State Government. The government also stated that many other camp occupants are sick with the disease and are being treated.

### **PROTEST ACTION**

- Students from the National Association of Nigerian Students (NANS) stormed the Murtala Muhammed International Airport in Lagos to press the government to end the Academic Staff Union of Universities (ASUU) strike, which has lasted nearly seven months. Recall NANS had previously stated that due to the ongoing strike, local and international airport operations will be suspended beginning Monday, September 18.

## WEEKLY SUMMARY ALERT

**ALERTS DATE:** 20th September, 2022

### ARMED ROBBERY

- The Abia State Police Command paraded a dismissed Department of State Services employee and nine other suspected robbers yesterday for robbery. On July 26, 2022, the suspects were part of a 14-man robbery gang that ambushed a bullion van near Ntigha Junction on the Enugu-Port Harcourt expressway. The cash officer of a new generation bank was killed on the spot during the robbery, while the suspects carted away an unspecified amount of cash being conveyed by the bullion van. Three police officers escorting the bullion van were injured, and one of the robbers was killed by the security men during a gun battle.

### BANDITRY

- Four people were allegedly killed in an attack by suspected armed bandits on the Fapo Community in Niger State's Lapai Local Government Area. It was also reported that eight people were critically injured and 15 were kidnapped by the bandits in the early hours of Monday in the village. According to reports, the bandits stormed the village on motorcycles, shooting intermittently and causing panic as they carried out their operation.
- Following the Nigeria Air Force (NAF) bombardment of hia camps in Zamfara forest, security operatives have been warned that dreaded bandit kingpin gangs may launch retaliatory attacks on Gusau-Sokoto-Zaria roads. According to a source, the gangs may stage retaliatory attacks in response to the killing of scores of bandits in the forest. Commuters on the Sokoto-Gusau Tsafe-Funtua road should avoid those areas for the time being, according to the source.

### FLOODING

- On Monday, flooding was caused by early morning rain, which flowed over a large portion of the Yola-Mubi highway, cutting off the capital Yola from the northern part of Adamawa State. Travelers from Yola to major northern Adamawa towns such as Song, Gombi, Hong, Mubi, Maiha, Michika, and Madagali, as well as those returning to Girei and Yola, had to stop on both sides of the flooded portion near Jabi Lamba, a rural community in Girei LGA, where the flood water over the road was deepest.
- Following the death of 14 people as a result of flooding, the Niger State Emergency Management Agency, NSEMA, has advised communities along the Niger River, Kwara and Kogi to relocate to safer areas. It stated that this is in response to the Nigerian Hydrological Services' advice to communities regarding the discharge of water from the Kainji and Jeba hydro dams in Niger State. In a statement issued in Minna, the Director General of NSEMA stated that the dams are releasing thousands of gallons of water per minute, which could cause the River Niger to overflow.
- Over 500 000 Nigerians have been affected by heavy flooding in 29 states of the federation and the Federal Capital Territory (FCT) this year, according to the director-general of the National Emergency Management Agency (NEMA). The director-general made the announcement yesterday during an emergency meeting in Abuja on Nigeria's flood situation. He stated that the disaster has already claimed 300 lives, injured 500 people, and displaced over 100,000 people.

## WEEKLY SUMMARY ALERT

### KIDNAPPING

- The Principal General of Madonna Community Secondary School, who was kidnapped two weeks ago, has regained his freedom after paying his kidnapers a ransom of four million, two hundred thousand naira. It may be recalled that the Principal was kidnapped on his way to church in his native home of Udianga, Etim Ekpo Local Government, and his SUV was taken, but was later abandoned and recovered by the police. According to reports, the kidnapers demanded N50 million but later settled for N4.2 million.
- On Monday, Justice of the Ikeja Special Offenses Court sentenced a kidnapping kingpin and his co-defendant to 21 years in prison for kidnapping. They were accused of conspiring and kidnapping a victim at about 5:30 pm on June 23, 2014, at Kara Street, Amuwo Odofin in Lagos and were alleged to have captured and detained the victim and demanded a ransom of \$2m.
- According to the Southern Kaduna Peoples Union, there is still no breathing space for communities in the southern part of the state, as terrorists, jihadists, bandits, and armed herdsmen continue to plunder and wreak havoc. The latest, according to the SOKAPU President, was the mass abductions on September 12 and 13, 2022, at Kasuwan Magani in Kajuru LGA of Southern Kaduna, where over 45 people were kidnapped.
- Jigawa State police have busted a notorious kidnapping syndicate and arrested two suspects who have been terrorizing the state. In a statement, the command's spokesman said the arrest was based on a silent operation carried out in Larabawa herdsmen camp in Kano State's Gabasawa LGA Area and Laraba Gurgunya village in Jigawa State's Taura LGA. According to the command's spokesman, preliminary investigations revealed that the suspects were responsible for the recent ambush and killing of an Immigration officer in Birniwa Local Government and a police officer in Kwalam village, Taura Local Government while on duty.

### PROTEST ACTION

- The National Association of Nigerians has stated that its protest at Murtala Muhammed International Airport is only a prelude to a week-long protest until the Federal Government agrees to its demands on the resolution of the Academic Staff Union of Universities strike action. NANS stated that it was prepared to ground the Nigerian Ports Authority and the Lagos Third Mainland Bridge.

### SHOOTING (GUNMEN)

- On Monday, the Benue State Police Command confirmed the death of three people in an attack in Tse Ngban village, Nyiev Council Ward, Guma Local Government Area, Benue State. The corpse of the deceased has been sent to the Benue State University Teaching Hospital, according to the Command's Public Relations Officers, who confirmed the incident. An investigation is ongoing. According to a resident in the area, the attackers besieged the Tse Ngban around 7pm and unleashed terror on the residents, adding that a woman was killed on the spot and two others died shortly after the attack from injuries inflicted on them by the armed assailants.

### **HOODLUMS**

- The Ogun State So-Safe Corps has arrested four men for allegedly terrorizing the Ihunbo community in the state's Ipokia Local Government. The four were arrested for allegedly mutilating two Ihunbo residents and causing the traditional ruler to cry for help. The State Commander of the Corps quoted the monarch as saying in a statement on Monday that there is an increase in attacks on the sons and daughters of the soil by some faceless miscreants for unknown reasons.

### **HERDSMEN**

- Suspected herders killed three people in a community in Benue State's Guma Local Government Area. Sunday evening, suspected herders were said to have invaded the Ngban community in Guma local government. The last three weeks have been a nightmare in some communities in the same local government, with no fewer than 13 people killed in Tse Numgbera, Umella, Yogbo, and Ukohol. According to locals, the latest attack occurred around 4 p.m. on Sunday, when suspected herders invaded Ngbea, which falls under the Nyiev council Ward of Guma local government.

### **TRAFFIC DIVERSION**

- From Tuesday, the Lagos State Government will redirect traffic from the Maryland-Mende Underpass. According to the Transportation Commissioner, the closure is part of the Opebi-Ojota bridge construction. The official assured residents that alternate routes had been planned to ease traffic congestion.

### **MURDER**

- The Kano Chinese community, through the Chinese Business Community Association of Nigeria, has condemned the alleged murder of a state indigene, by a Chinese national, her lover. The killing was condemned by the community, led by its leader. The community described the alleged killing as a criminal act that should be handled professionally by relevant security agencies, according to a statement issued yesterday.

### **ALERTS DATE: 21st September, 2022**

#### **ASSAULT**

- A teacher was sentenced to seven years in prison by the Ikeja Special Offences Court for sexually assaulting a 16-year-old student in a school. However, the Judge ruled that the prosecution had failed to prove the charge of defilement. The judge stated that the defendant's voluntary confessional statement showed that he sexually assaulted the minor. The defendant admitted to fondling the victim's breast twice and attempting to have sex with her but failing because she was a virgin.

#### **COMMON ROBBERY**

- Katsina State Police have apprehended three suspected robbers who used charms to break into houses in Daura Local Government Area. In a statement issued on Tuesday, the Public Relations Officer announced their arrest. The trio were apprehended after a tip last week, according to the spokesman.



## **WEEKLY SUMMARY ALERT**

### **FLOODING**

- Since August, Jigawa State has experienced widespread flooding due to torrential rainfall, which has resulted in 98 deaths. The majority of the fatalities, according to the police, were caused by drowning, thunderstorms, and falling buildings. The State Emergency Management Agency (SEMA) reported on Tuesday that there have now been 98 flood-related fatalities. According to the head of SEMA, the situation has gotten worse as more communities have been affected by flooding. He claimed that over 57,000 homes were destroyed by the flood, and at least 100,000 people were left homeless.
- Following several days of rain, 400 homes in Pilgani District of Langtang North Local Council of Plateau State were submerged by floodwaters, and several hectares of farmland were washed away. The council's most affected communities are Zamadede, Shilur, Pische, Agwangani, and Galang. A resident of Zamadede village, stated that everything had been destroyed, with over 200 people displaced as a result of the unfortunate incident.

### **KIDNAPPING**

- The Rivers State Police Command has confirmed the release of four of the passengers kidnapped last Saturday along the Emohua/Kalabari axis of the state's East-West road. The victims were released on Monday night, according to the state Police Command spokesman, who announced this in Port Harcourt on Tuesday. It was unclear, however, whether a ransom was paid for the release of the kidnapped victims.
- Yesterday, the OYO State Police Command paraded 15 suspected kidnapers in various locations, in addition to rescuing victims and recovering various firearms and ammunition in the state. The state Commissioner of Police, who paraded the suspects at the Police Headquarters in Ibadan, stated that some of the suspects had a habit of intercepting parents as they drove their children and wards to school in Ibadan and its environs. He claimed that they were all apprehended from their respective hideouts throughout the state.
- Ondo State police arrested two suspected kidnapers for attempting to abduct a victim. The police paraded the suspects on Tuesday in Akure, where they were accused of attacking and kidnapping a victim on August 28th while she was working in her shop in Ofosu. According to the state's police spokesperson, the suspects drove a gray Toyota to commit the crime. The suspects were eventually apprehended by a team of police officers from the Anti-Kidnapping Squad. They confessed to the crime and the victims were freed unharmed.

### **PROTEST ACTION**

- Public university students in Nigeria claim that everything is prepared to halt operations at the Nnamdi Azikiwe International Airport in the federal capital territory (FCT), Abuja. The most recent decision was made in response to the success seen in Lagos on Monday, when traffic into and out of the Murtala Muhammed International Airport (MMIA) was blocked for several hours. The National Association of Nigerian Students (NANS), which represents the protesters, claimed that the decision to obstruct travel at the airports was made as part of a plan to confront the Nigerian ruling class so that they would understand the plight of the students at public universities



## WEEKLY SUMMARY ALERT

### SHOOTING

- The Islamic State of West African Province (ISWAP) killed two Boko Haram officials when they stormed the rival faction's enclaves at midnight on September 17, 2022, in Gaizuwa, Bama Local Government. The two Commanders were reportedly executed in silent operations by the ISWAP, as their remains were discovered in their homes in the early morning of September 18. According to a Counter-Insurgency Expert and Security Analyst in Lake Chad, prior to the latest attack, Boko Haram had vowed to avenge the deaths of 29 terrorists, including a top commander, who were ambushed by ISWAP terrorists.

### SHOOTING (GUNMEN)

- A sixty-year-old woman from the Rahoss community in Plateau State's Riyom Local Government Area was killed by a group of people suspected to be Fulani militias. According to an eyewitness, the incident occurred on Monday when the deceased went to fetch firewood but was not seen returning home until late in the day. According to him, the body was later discovered after a vigorous search, while one of the militias fully armed was seen close to where her body was found. He went on to say that when security officers arrived in the community, they gave the elements a hot chase and eventually arrested eight members of the militia.

### STRIKE ACTION

- The federal government and the Academic Staff Union of Universities (ASUU) have come to a new agreement. Following a four-hour meeting at the National Assembly in Abuja on Tuesday, the House of Representatives' leadership mediated the new agreement. The agreement, however, is subject to President Muhammadu Buhari's approval, who is currently attending the United Nations General Assembly meeting in New York.

### RAPE

- Following the gang-rape of a 14-year-old girl by three suspected herdsmen, there is palpable fear in the Kwarra community of Wamba Local Government Area, Nasarawa State. According to a source, the herdsmen, who were armed with knives and other sharp objects, invaded the teenage girl's home on Monday night and forcibly took her to a bush in the area, where she was raped to coma. On Tuesday, the state's Police Public Relations Officer confirmed the incident in Lafia and said two herdsmen had been arrested in connection with the crime.

### ALERTS DATE: 22nd September, 2022

### ARMED ROBBERY

- Three months after being fired, a former chief security officer of a company in Sango-Ota, in the Ado-Odo/Ota Local Government Area of Ogun State, is said to have hired robbers to attack his former employers. He allegedly fled after the robbers he allegedly hired were apprehended. According to the state Police Public Relations Officer, five of the suspects were apprehended after receiving a tip.

## WEEKLY SUMMARY ALERT

---

### ARMS & AMMUNITION

- The National Drug Law Enforcement Agency's (NDLEA) Kogi State Command has turned over four suspected criminals arrested along the Okene/Lokoja-Abuja Expressway to the Police Command for further investigation. The four suspects were apprehended by the NDLEA on September 17th and interrogated before being handed over to the Kogi State Police command. Two of the suspects were intercepted in a J-5 bus carrying 18 pump-action guns with 1300 cartridges/ammunition, while the other two were arrested in a luxurious bus carrying 1000 live cartridges/ammunition, according to the Kogi State Commander of NDLEA.

### BANDITRY

- Nigeria's military has begun dropping leaflets and broadcasting jingles to warn residents of impending operations and offensives against terrorists and bandits. This comes just 48 hours after a surprise raid by aircraft in Zamfara State, which allegedly killed dozens of bandits. According to a defense intelligence source, leaflets and jingles have been produced to warn citizens living in areas prone to banditry in Zamfara and other states in an effort to avoid collateral damage in the renewed military operations.
- Following the attacks in some Zamfara communities that resulted in the deaths of many residents, the camps of notorious bandit leaders Bello Turji and Dan Bokolo are said to be engaged in a fierce battle. According to reports, the Dan Bokolo camp allegedly launched a series of attacks on some villages in the state's Shinkafi Local Government Area. According to reports, residents along the Shinkafi and Moriki axes have now fled their communities as a result of the renewed conflict between the two rival camps.

### KIDNAPPING

- Police officers led by the Divisional Police Officer rescued a kidnapped victim in Delta State's Agbarho Division, Ughelli North Local Government Area. The victim was rescued after the Divisional Police Officer received information that some armed hoodlums were at the victim's residence on Railway Station Road Agbarho and had kidnapped and driven him out of the premises towards the railway. When the hoodlums saw the policemen, they fired sporadically at them, but the police equally responded, and the hoodlums abandoned the victim and ran into the bush due to the superior firepower of the police. The victim, who was tied and kept in the boot of the car, was rescued unharmed. When the vehicle was searched, fifty (50) live cartridges were discovered.

### INSECURITY

- The men of the Ondo State Security Network Agency, also known as Amotekun, arrested 45 people for allegedly engaging in various criminal activities in the state recently. According to the corps, the suspects were involved in a variety of criminal offenses, including kidnapping, armed robbery, stealing, stealing motorbikes, and rape, among others, and they were apprehended in various locations throughout the state. The suspects were paraded at the Amotekun headquarters in Akure, the state capital, on Wednesday, and the state Commander of the corps said they were arrested within two weeks.

### INSECURITY

- Nigeria's military has begun dropping leaflets and broadcasting jingles to warn residents of impending operations and offensives against terrorists and bandits. This comes just 48 hours after a surprise raid by aircraft in Zamfara State, which allegedly killed dozens of bandits. According to a defense intelligence source, leaflets and jingles have been produced to warn citizens living in areas prone to banditry in Zamfara and other states in an effort to avoid collateral damage in the renewed military operations.
- Due to the renewed military assaults by valiant troops of Operation Hadin Kai, 17 Boko Haram terrorists, including their family members, surrendered with their weapons to troops of the 151 Task Force Battalion stationed at Banki-Junction in Borno State's Bama LGA. The Nigerian Army confirmed this in a post. The army stated that profiling of the surrendered terrorists is ongoing.
- In the 11 years since the armed invasion of rural areas in Benue State, at least 5,000 people have been killed in 200 attacks. Governor Samuel Ortom stated the figures during the signing of the Benue State PeaceBuilding and Reconciliation Commission Bill into law on Wednesday.

### EPIDEMIC

- A cholera outbreak in the Hajj camp in Maiduguri, where about 12,000 surrendered Boko Haram fighters are currently held, has killed at least 25 people, including 20 surrendered Boko Haram fighters. It was learned that at least seven people died on Tuesday, and 14 more died on Wednesday in the Hajj camp. According to a source, health workers are battling the fatalities with the help of non-governmental organizations and the World Health Organization.

### RTA

- According to the state's Commissioner of Police, 351 people were killed in road accidents in Oyo State in the last nine months. The major causes of the accidents, according to the commissioner, were speeding, reckless driving, driving against traffic, burst tyres, and brake failure.

#### ARMED ROBBERY

- Residents of Gowon Estate, Egbeda, in Lagos State's Alimosho Local Government Area, have complained about alleged robbery attacks on their estate. According to reports, the hoodlums typically targeted apartment buildings, robbing residents of their money and other valuables. According to sources, the majority of the buildings lacked perimeter fences, making it easier for robbers to gain access to apartments.

#### ATTEMPTED KIDNAPPING

- The police in Enugu State have confirmed that kidnappers attempted to kidnap some travelers on the Ugwuomo Nike-Opi-Nsukka Road. Residents had raised the alarm after the road was blocked twice in 48 hours by suspected Fulani herdsmen. According to a statement released by the State Police Public Relations Officer, operatives rushed to the scene and foiled the kidnapping attempt.

### **SHOOTING (GUNMEN)**

- The Abia State Police Command has confirmed an attack on its team in the state capital of Umuahia. In the Wednesday attack, two police officers were injured and their rifles were taken away, according to the state Police Public Relations Officer. According to reports, the police team was attacked by fleeing gunmen around 8.30 p.m. on Wednesday. According to a source, the gunmen had probably robbed someone and were fleeing when they came across the police team.
- Suspected herders have killed 15 people in Mchia and Mou communities in Benue State's Logo Local Government Area. According to a community leader, Armed Fulani herdsmen attacked Mchia village in Mbagber council ward, Logo LGA, around 10 p.m. on September 21, 2022. They murdered 12 people and shot 15 others, including children, who are currently being treated at the NKST hospital in Anyiin.

### **THEFT**

- According to the Defense Headquarters, troops from Operation Delta Safe apprehended 17 oil thieves and dismantled several illegal refineries in the South-South zone on Thursday. This was stated by the Director, Defense Media Operations, at the bi-weekly news briefing on armed forces operations on Thursday in Abuja. According to the Director of Defense Media Operations, the troops conducted patrol, raids, clearance, and swamp buggy operations in Delta, Bayelsa, and Rivers States' creeks, villages, communities, and towns.

### **VANDALISM**

- Eight more people have been arrested in various parts of the South-East for vandalizing Enugu Electricity Distribution Company, PLC, EEDC facilities. The EEDC's Head of Corporate Communications, who confirmed the arrests, attributed the service disruptions in some parts of its network to vandalism

### **BOAT MISHAP**

- The Benue State Command has confirmed that six people died and eight others are missing after a boat carrying about 40 passengers capsized in the river near Fada village in Benue State's Guma Local Government Area. According to a statement issued by the Benue State Police Public Relations Officer on Thursday, twenty-six people have been recovered, with the remaining eight people still missing.

### **MANSLAUGHTER**

- On Thursday, Justice Adenike Coker of the Lagos High Court in Ikeja sentenced a former cop, to life in prison for the death of a football fan, The ex-cop, who was assigned to the Nigeria Police's Special Anti-Cultism Squad, shot the deceased in the lower abdomen on March 31, 2019, at a viewing center in Mangoro, Ikeja, Lagos. Justice Coker found the defendant guilty of the charge and sentenced him to life imprisonment with the condition that he serve a minimum of 25 years in prison.


### **COMMUNAL CLASH**

Several houses were also said to have been burned during the clash, which resulted in youths blocking the Makurdi-Gboko highway on Thursday. According to reports, the two communities, Iparev and Iharev, known as settlers and indigenous peoples, respectively, renewed their age-old land dispute on Wednesday.

### **INSECURITY**


- Troops from Operation Hadarin Daji apprehended two terrorist collaborators in Zaria, Kaduna State, who were linked to the terrorists' financier. The Director, Defense Media Operations, announced this at the bi-weekly news briefing on armed forces operations on Thursday in Abuja. According to the Director of Defence Media Operations, the suspects were apprehended on 15 September at the Access Bank, PZ Branch in Zaria while attempting to withdraw N14 million from the account of the said suspected terrorist financier.
- According to the Defence Headquarters, troops from Operation Hadin Kadin have killed more than 36 terrorists and several others in air strikes across the North-east in the last two weeks. This was stated by the Director, Defense Media Operations, at the bi-weekly news briefing on armed forces operations on Thursday in Abuja. Two top commanders of Boko Haram and the Islamic States in West African Province (ISWAP) terrorists were among those killed during the period, according to the Director of Defence Media Operations.


