DAILY SUMMARY ALERT

ALERTS DATE

The following section illustrates the date alerts were reported on Monday, 31st October, 2022.

ATTACK

- Nigerian troops reportedly repulsed a terrorist attack on 221 Battalion Wawa Cantonment, New Bussa in Niger state's Borgu Local Government Area on Sunday morning. According to reports, the attack was thwarted by a quick response from the military and men from the 401 air combat training group New Bussa. According to reports, due to the military's cordoning off of the area, movement between the communities of Wawa and New Bussa has been restricted.
- The Inspector-General of Police has stated that the recent security alert should have been issued to the police rather than the general public, while urging the police to remain on top of the situation. The governments of the United States and the United Kingdom issued a security alert, advising their citizens to avoid Abuja due to a planned terrorist attack. According to reports, Julius Berger, a multinational construction company, has closed its operations in Nigeria's Federal Capital Territory, Abuja. The decision was made in response to the terror alert issued by the US government and the United Kingdom (UK), which advised their citizens not to travel to Abuja.
- The Nigeria Police Force has denied reports that the Federal Capital Territory of Abuja has been inundated with bombs, claiming that Abuja is safe and there is no imminent threat. According to the Force Public Relations Officer, such rumors would not benefit the country and would instead cause panic among residents. We continue to stress that the Federal Capital Territory is secure and not under immediate threat, and we can also confirm that it is not overrun with bombs as reported in the media.
- Pandemonium reigned at Dan Jamfari Community in Kano State's Rogo Local Government Area after gunmen suspected of being Islamic terrorists stormed Barbaji village and burned down about ten houses. Villagers were forced to flee their homes as a result of the attack. The incident was condemned by the Executive Secretary of the Kano State Emergency Management Agency, who confirmed it on Friday.

BANDITRY

- According to the Zamfara State Police Command, the ongoing commitment of the police and other security agencies to bring insecurity to a halt in the state was yielding positive results, as four kidnapped victims, including a year-old child, were rescued from Zamfara forest. According to a statement signed by the state police spokesman, the Command received an intelligence report on bandits' plans to attack and abduct locals in the state's Bukkuyum, Tsafe, Bungudu, Gusau, and Maru Local Government Areas. The Police Tactical Operatives, in collaboration with the vigilantes, conducted a rigorous patrol, repelling the planned attacks and maintaining a confidence-building patrol to avert any threat to such communities.
- On Saturday, the Katsina State Police Command said it repelled a bandit attack, rescued 21 kidnapped victims, and recovered 20 rustled cows. In a statement issued on Saturday, the command's Police Public Relations Officer stated that the command received distress calls on Saturday. According to him, the Area Commander led a team of police tactical units, blocked their exit route at Gandun Sarki village, engaged them in a fierce gun duel, and successfully rescued all of the kidnapped victims as well as the rustled cows.

DAILY SUMMARY ALERT

KIDNAPPING

- Gunmen reportedly demanded N50 million in ransom after kidnapping a former Deputy Vice Chancellor (Academics) of the University of Ibadan. The Professor, who is on sabbatical at Olabisi Onabanjo University (OOU), was on his way to Ibadan around 6 p.m. on Friday when kidnappers stopped him near the Sat Guru Maharaji Garden and kidnapped him. According to a source, the kidnappers killed some police officers before fleeing with their captives.
- During a shootout with suspected kidnappers on the Lagos-Ibadan Expressway on Friday night, at least one police officer was killed and another was injured. According to reports, the suspected bandits kidnapped several motorists and passengers in vehicles traveling along the expressway. As a result of the development, several other vehicles on the expressway abandoned their journeys and drove in the opposite direction.
- Ohanaeze, a South-East group, has accused Nigerian security agencies of complicity and demanded a thorough investigation into the circumstances surrounding the wave of kidnappings along the Enugu-Ugwuogo Nike-Nsukka Road. According to reports, commuters returning to Nsukka were attacked by gunmen believed to be Fulani herdsmen along the Ugwuogo-Nike-Opi-Nsukka road and abducted many people, including students from the University of Nigeria Nsukka, UNN, and some state politicians. In response to the incident, the Ohanaeze Ndigbo Youth Council stated that information obtained from one of the victims demonstrates a chain of communication between the hoodlums and the security operatives stationed at various checkpoints along the road. In a statement issued on Saturday by its president, Ohanaeze stated that all security personnel on duty at the time of the incidents should be investigated.
- Terrorists kidnapped the District Head of Birnin Tsaba in Zamfara State's Zurmi Local Government Area. The victim and his younger brother, a member of the All Progressives Congress in the area, were kidnapped. According to a local, the district head and his brother were abducted at their homes around 4.30 a.m. on Friday. According to a family member of the victims, the attack on the two victims was carried out by a notorious terrorist leader.
- One of the passengers kidnapped on the Lagos-Ibadan expressway on Friday has been released. On Friday, some passengers were abducted along the Lagos-Ibadan expressway, according to reports. One of the kidnapped victims, a Princess, has been released. The Princess is one of Onpetu's daughters from the Ijeru kingdom in Oyo State. According to palace sources, the palace has been informed of her release.
- Gunmen who kidnapped two female Moshood Abiola Polytechnic (MAPOLY) students in Abeokuta, Ogun State, have reduced the ransom from N20 million to N4 million. Following their kidnapping along the popular Lagos-Ibadan expressway on Friday, the kidnappers, who had previously killed a police officer, told the students' parents that they must pay a N20 million ransom or have their daughters killed. According to reports, the Business Administration students had left Abeokuta around 5 p.m. for a birthday party in Ibadan when they were kidnapped.
- The Nigeria Police Force, Oyo State Command, confirmed the release of a former Deputy Vice-Chancellor of the University of Ibadan by his kidnappers on Monday. The state police spokesperson confirmed this in Ibadan. On Friday night, gunmen in military uniform abducted the Professor and other travelers near Dominica University on the Lagos-Ibadan Expressway.

DAILY SUMMARY ALERT

SHOOTING (GUNMEN)

- The Cross River State Command of the Nigeria Police Force has confirmed the death of a police sergeant who was killed by unknown gunmen on Edgerton Street in Calabar, the state capital. It was discovered that the assailants killed the cop and stole his rifle. This was stated in a statement signed by the State Police Public Relations Officer, who condemned the incident.
- At least three people were killed in a new attack by suspected armed herdsmen on the Tse-Ikyem community in the Ukemberagya Gaambetiev District of Benue State's LGA. A resident confirmed that numerous other locals were injured in the attack on Saturday around 4 o'clock. He also stated that many people were injured during the attack, which occurred at the same location where two people were murdered last Sunday.

INSECURITY

- Following reports of security threats in Abuja and other parts of Nigeria, the Inspector General of Police assured Nigerians of the Nigeria Police Force's commitment to providing adequate security and prompt response when necessary. The IGP also reaffirmed the police department's commitment to collaborating with other security agencies across the country to ensure citizens' safety. The Force Public Relations Officer confirmed this in a statement. According to the statement, the IGP ordered the immediate activation of all emergency numbers throughout the country to full capacity for a 24/7 prompt response, with combatant officers and men on standby to respond to emergency situations and distress calls.




