



Nigeria Weekly Summary of Security Update
10th - 14th October, 2022.



WEEKLY SUMMARY ALERT

The following section illustrates the date alerts were reported from 10th - 14th October, 2022.

ALERTS DATE: 10th October, 2022

ARMS & AMMUNITION

- A suspected bandit was apprehended on the outskirts of Kaduna by Kaduna State Police Command operatives. On Saturday, October 8, 2022, operatives of the Command apprehended a serial arms and ammunition supplier from Nasa Village in Kachia LGA with a large quantity of 7.62mm caliber live ammunition near Galadimawa Village in Giwa LGA.

ATTACK

- Residents of Kulas, in Plateau State's Bokkos Local Government Area, were in mourning on Sunday after four people were killed by suspected terrorists. It was discovered that two village elders and two other locals were among the terrorists' victims. The attack on the Kulas community was confirmed by the spokesman for the military task force in charge of maintaining peace in the state.
- Eight insurgents were reportedly killed when Boko Haram fighters clashed with members of the terrorists' Islamic State in West Africa Province (ISWAP) faction on the outskirts of Lake Chad. The ISWAP also seized large quantities of ammunition during an inter-rivalry clash on October 6, when an ISWAP team attacked and killed a large number of its adversaries at Krinowa axis in the north-east of Marte in Borno State.

KIDNAPPING

- The kidnapping and murder of Chief of Ora-Igbomina, Oke-Ila Local Government Area, Osun State, has been announced by the Osun State Police Command. According to the command's spokesperson, the report of the kidnapped Chief was made by his son on Saturday, October 8, 2022, at the Oke-Ila Police Division on Sunday in Osogbo. According to the statement, the Chief left his home in Kereja Ora-Igbomina with an unknown commercial motorcyclist around 0500hrs on 05/10/2022 and did not return home for four (4) days. The motorcyclist was apprehended following an intelligence-led investigation. He revealed the location of the victim's death and burial in the forest.
- According to reports from Oyo State's Oke Ogun geopolitical zone, gunmen have abducted some farmers. The farmers were kidnapped in the Ipapo/Iseyin communities. According to sources, four farmers, one of whom is a woman, were kidnapped on Saturday. The State government has confirmed the abduction of the victims. A security team composed of police and the military has been dispatched to support the area's existing security architecture, according to the government's Commissioner for Agriculture and Natural Resources.

WEEKLY SUMMARY ALERT

SHOOTING (GUNMEN)

- Unknown gunmen assassinated a Deputy Superintendent of Police (DSP) and an Inspector in charge of the Umuna Divisional Police Headquarters in Onuimo local government area of Imo State. According to reports, the deceased police officers were on a stop and search in front of the Divisional Police Headquarters when they were gunned down by gunmen wearing military uniforms driving a black Hilux vehicle and fleeing to an unknown destination.
- Suspected gunmen attacked the Inyi Police Station in Enugu State's Oji River local government area, killing two police officers. According to sources, two police officers and two civilians were killed during the attack, which lasted several minutes. According to reports, the gunmen stormed the station and set it on fire on Sunday morning. Before carrying out the attacks, the gunmen were heard chanting "No election and no police in Biafra land."
- Gunmen killed the All Progressives Congress (APC) youth leader in Enugu State's Igbo-Eze South local government area on Saturday. The youth leader was reportedly murdered at his hometown, Unadu community in Igbo-Eze South local government, in broad daylight while riding his motorcycle. The police have confirmed the killing and launched an investigation to find those responsible.
- A Chinese expatriate was killed by gunmen in Ebonyi State, south-east Nigeria. According to sources, the incident occurred on Sunday at a mining site in Iboko, Izzi Local Government Area of the state. The gunmen reportedly disarmed police operatives who were protecting the expatriate. The Chairman of Izzi Local Government Area, who confirmed the incident, expressed outrage over the killing, calling it a national embarrassment.

ARMED ROBBERY

- Kwara State Police Command officers apprehended three suspected armed robbers who were terrorizing Kwara State University (KWASU) Malete students and other residents of the community. The arrest of the gang's leader came after KWASU students reported the latest armed robbery operation in Malete to police. According to reports, the arrested gang leader led police to their hideout, where his two accomplices were apprehended.

BOAT MISHAP

- A boat mishap in Umunnakwe Community, Ogbaru Local Government Area, Anambra State, Nigeria's South-east, is thought to have killed 76 people. The incident occurred on Friday, according to reports. The boat capsized on its way to Nkwo Market in Ogbakuba Community in the council area after leaving Onukwu Bridge. According to reports, only nine of the 85 people on board were immediately rescued.

WEEKLY SUMMARY ALERT

ATTACK

- According to reports, a Nigerian Air Force strike in Kaduna's Giwa Local Government Area resulted in the deaths of a well-known terrorist in the state as well as numerous of his fighters. According to reports, the Air Component of Operation WHIRL Punch carried out the raid over the weekend. According to a security source, the notorious terrorist and his cohorts left Niger State for Giwa Local Government Area in Kaduna after airstrikes on their former hideout became more intense. The terrorists were hiding at a residence in the Giwa council area before being killed by airstrikes.
- Separate airstrikes targeted a terrorist hideout 33 kilometers north-west of Mando in Kaduna, killing many of the terrorists. According to a security source, the location was struck after credible intelligence of terrorist leaders and their foot soldiers converging under tree covers at the location for a meeting. The Nigerian Air Force spokesperson confirmed the airstrikes, adding that the Air Component is adhering to the Chief of Air Staff's directive to maintain the offensive against terrorists.

KIDNAPPING

- The Kaduna State Police Command apprehended three suspects along the Kaduna-Abuja Expressway and other locations, recovering an assault rifle, two rifle magazines, and over 521 live ammunition from the suspects. In a statement issued on Monday, the Command's Public Relations Officer (PPRO) stated that the suspects had made confessional statements that were assisting the Police in their investigations.
- On Saturday, bandits killed one of the recently released Abuja-Kaduna train passengers along the Funtua-Gusau road, en route to his home town in Kebbi State. The victim was killed on his way to his home town in Kebbi State with his relatives, who were reunited with him by Kaduna State authorities after being rescued last week. According to the report, one of the relatives driving the vehicle was also abducted by the terrorists and taken to an unknown location.
- An assistant Chief Surveyor at the office of the Surveyor-General of the Federation was reportedly kidnapped and killed by gunmen operating along the Abuja-Lokoja Road. The deceased was returning to Abuja from a function when he was abducted last week at Yakwo Farm's sharp bend in Abaji. The deceased went to a function, the flood in Lokoja delayed him for two days, and when the water receded, he continued the journey with his mother and son, according to the Director of Press. Three of them were abducted in his car in the Abaji area. He went on to say that the deceased was killed, but the mother and son were kept somewhere and we were able to rescue them.

BANDITRY

- On Saturday, bandits killed one of the recently released Abuja-Kaduna train passengers along the Funtua-Gusau road, en route to his home town in Kebbi State. The victim was killed on his way to his home town in Kebbi State with his relatives, who were reunited with him by Kaduna State authorities after being rescued last week. According to the report, one of the relatives driving the vehicle was also abducted by the terrorists and taken to an unknown location.



WEEKLY SUMMARY ALERT

ARMED ROBBERY

- The police have apprehended three brothers and a friend for carrying out a series of robberies in the Ijebu-Ode area of Ogun State. According to the Ogun State police image maker, their arrest followed a distress call received at Igbeba divisional headquarters that some armed robbers invaded a Lotto agent's shop in Ijebu Ode's Odi Olowo area and stole money. During the operation, the robbers also stole a motorcycle. The DPO of Igbeba division was said to have immediately led his patrol team to the scene, gave the robbers a hot chase, and succeeded in arresting one of them, who later led detectives to their hideout in Lagos State's Epe area, where the three brothers were apprehended.

ARMS & AMMUNITION

- On routine stop-and-search duty along Ibori road, officers from the Oghara Police Division in Delta State's Ethiope-West Local Government Area arrested a 35-year-old man. The officers, led by the Divisional Crime Officer, also recovered one locally-made cut-to-size gun loaded with one live cartridge from the suspect. According to reports, the police apprehended the suspect and subjected him to a search, during which he was arrested and the items were recovered.
- On Aberdeen patrol, Delta State Command's Eagle-Net Squad recovered one locally-made cut-to-size double barrel gun and one locally-made shotgun from a fleeing suspect in Warri. According to reports, the suspect was identified as a male passenger in a minibus carrying a small bag. According to a police public relations officer who confirmed the incident, the suspect's action was suspicious, so the operative went after him. When the suspect realized the cops were closing in on him, he abandoned the bag and fled into a nearby river. According to him, Upon searching the bag, one locally made cut-to-size double barrel gun, and one locally made short gun were recovered.

ARSON

- Unidentified gunmen attacked a section of the Ezza North Local Government Headquarters, according to the Ebonyi Police Command. According to reports, hoodlums set fire to the property on Monday morning, destroying valuables worth millions of naira. The attack occurred in the early hours of Monday, according to the Chairman of the Council.

NATURAL DISASTER

- The National Emergency Management Agency (NEMA) and the Military's Disaster Response Unit (DRU) have launched an aerial search for people who have been displaced or trapped by rising floodwaters in Anambra. The NEMA South-East Zonal Coordinator made the announcement on Monday in Awka. He stated that Search and Rescue (SAR) operations have begun. The Military DRU has enlisted and begun Air Recce or Aerial View to collect imagery intelligence from the affected communities.

SHOOTING (GUNMEN)

- Nine Tiv farmers from the Gidan Sule community in Nasarawa State's Keana Local Government Area have reportedly been killed by gunmen suspected to be Fulani herdsmen. According to reports, the incident happened on Saturday when gunmen armed with AK-47 rifles stormed the neighborhood and opened fire on residents. Nine people were said to have died as a result of the shootings, while women and children who managed to flee with gunshot wounds were still missing.

KIDNAPPING

- One of the farmers kidnapped on Saturday in Iseyin, Oyo State, has been killed. On Saturday, the Oyo State Government confirmed the kidnapping of four farmers in Iseyin. The government stated that it had sent some security agents to the town to ensure the farmers' release. According to reports, the kidnappers demanded a ransom for the victims before killing one of them.
- Terrorists holding two daughters and one domestic staff of Zamfara State's immediate former Accountant General have threatened to turn them into criminals who will be used to attract other targets of their criminal activities if their parent does not pay the ransom demanded. The children and an unnamed domestic staff have been held captive for 128 days. They were kidnapped in June.
- The Parents Teachers Association of Nigeria (PTAN) has requested that President Muhammadu Buhari secure the release of the remaining female students at the Federal Government College Birnin Yauri in Kebbi State. The call was made by the association's National President on Tuesday. He requested that the president employ the same tactics used to secure the remaining Abuja-Kaduna train victims.
- The daughter of a businesswoman in the Kwara state capital of Ilorin, who was reportedly kidnapped on Thursday, has been released. According to reports, the girl was released after her kidnappers were paid a N5 million ransom. Gunmen reportedly stormed their home in Alagbado Community, Ilorin, at midnight last Thursday and shot her brother through a window before abducting her when they couldn't find her mother, their primary target.

ATTEMPTED KIDNAPPING

- Ogun police have arrested three men for allegedly attempting to kidnap their former employer who fired them in the state's Ijebu-Ode area. The police announced this in a statement on Tuesday. According to the command's spokesperson, the trio were apprehended after a complaint was lodged at the Igbeba divisional police headquarters. According to him, the detectives launched a technical and intelligence-based investigation, which led them to Anambra State, where they apprehended two of the suspects. He claimed that their arrest led the detectives to Ago Iwoye, where the third suspect was apprehended.

CULTISM ATTACK

- Rivers State Police Command tactical team members have been deployed to the Diobu axis of Port Harcourt City Local Government Area in response to rampaging cultists' activities. Suspected cultists armed with lethal weapons were reported to have ransacked Eagle Island, Timber, Echue, and the stretch of Illabouchi, attacking and robbing passersby and shop owners. The rampaging cultists are members of a cult group whose member was reportedly hacked to death last Sunday night in Mile two Diobu Port Harcourt by a faction of the same cult group.

WEEKLY SUMMARY ALERT

FLOODING

- The Nigeria Meteorological Agency (NiMet) has warned that states in Nigeria's north-central and south-eastern regions should brace themselves for more flooding. On the sidelines of the ongoing Hydro-meteorological status and outlook system (HydroSOS) in Abuja on Tuesday, the director-general of NiMet stated this. While speaking about the current flood impact across the country, the director-general stated that while flooding caused by rainfall may have peaked, flooding caused by the opening of dams and other water holding facilities would continue to affect states in the North-Central and South-East.
- As a result of recent flood disasters across the country, the Federal Government has declared over 500 Nigerians dead and 1,411,051 affected. This was declared by the permanent secretary of the Ministry of Humanitarian Affairs, Disaster Management, and Social Development in Abuja on Tuesday while providing updates on recent flood incidents. He stated that 31 states and the Federal Capital Territory were affected. He also claimed that 146,734 hectares of farmland had been destroyed and 89,348 homes had been damaged.

SHOOTING (GUNMEN)

- Some soldiers and police officers have condemned the assassination of their colleagues in Enugu state by gunmen suspected of being members of the Eastern Security Network. ESN is the militant wing of separatist group Indigenous People of Biafra (IPOB). On Monday morning, gunmen said to be enforcing the South-East region's Monday sit-at-home were said to have killed three soldiers and a policeman in Achi, Oji River local government area of Enugu State.
- The Nigeria Police have vowed to track down and apprehend the killers of a Chinese national at a mining site in Ebonyi State, in the country's southeast. On Saturday, gunmen attacked a mining site in Otam Nwogba village in the state's Izzi local government area, close to the state's border with Benue State, killing a Chinese expatriate. The Chinese man and a policeman both suffered gunshot wounds as a result of the attackers' indiscriminate shooting at the scene, according to the reports. Later, the Chinese passed away in a hospital.

CRIME

- According to the police in Adamawa, 45 suspects were detained in September on suspicion of kidnapping, culpable homicide, and other crimes. On Tuesday in Yola, Adamawa, the deputy commissioner of police (DCP) in charge of operations said this. He stated that after the investigation, all suspects would be vigorously prosecuted.
- A Nigerian soldier was apprehended and charged with stealing and selling ammunition to Boko Haram terrorists. The soldier was disarmed, searched, and found to be carrying ammunition. The soldier is said to have been a member of the 156 Task Force Battalion, also known as Operation Hadin Kai, in Mainok, Borno state.

WEEKLY SUMMARY ALERT

ALERTS DATE: 13th October, 2022

ATTACK

- In a new pushback, Nigerian Armed Forces troops successfully thwarted an ambush by Boko Haram and Islamic State of West African Province terrorists. According to our sources, the troops of the 21 Armored Brigade, Bama, foiled the ambush during a fighting patrol between the Kumshe and Banki axes of Borno State in the early hours of Tuesday. According to an intelligence source who confirmed the incident, soldiers repelled the terrorists after the non-state actors detonated an Improvised Explosive Device and then opened fire. The special forces were said to have repulsed the attack, killing 19 insurgents while suffering no casualties on the military side
- Militants from Boko Haram's Islamic State-backed West Africa Province (ISWAP), formerly known as Jam'at Ahl as-Sunnah lid-Dakwah wal-Jihad, have killed two Civilian Joint Task Force (CJTF) members in Borno State. Two other members of the CJTF were also injured, according to a Counter-Insurgency Expert and Security Analyst in Lake Chad. Terrorists are said to have ambushed security personnel in the early hours of Tuesday between Pulka and Ngoshe in Gwoza Local Government Area.

BANDITRY

- Two people have been detained by the Zamfara State Police Command on suspicion of being informants who were allegedly working with bandits in the state's Munhaye forest in the Tsafe Local Government Area. The suspects were identified by the state Commissioner of Police, who spoke through the command spokesman. According to the commissioner, the suspects were apprehended on October 6, 2022, by Police Tactical Operatives based on intelligence that they were collaborating with notorious bandits operating out of Munhaye Forest.

FLOODING

- A family of six drowned after a flood hit Anambra East Local Government Area in Anambra State. According to reports, the incident occurred on Tuesday in the Nzam community. After their house was submerged, the family drowned. Before being swept away by the flood, the family was reportedly preparing to leave for a safe location. In a press conference, the National Emergency Management Agency, NEMA, stated that it has begun aerial surveillance, using helicopters to rescue trapped residents of flooded areas.
- A bridge connecting about seven communities and several camps in Anambra State's riverine Ogbaru local government area has collapsed. As a result of the incident, which occurred in the early hours of Wednesday, thousands of people have been stranded by this year's flooding in the area, cut off from their family and friends. Umunankwo, Mputu, Ogwuaniocha, Ossomala, Obeagwe, Akili Ogidi, and Ogwuikpele are among the communities affected. According to reports, an outboard engine boat carrying about 85 passengers, mostly traders, from Umunankwo to the nearby Nkwo Ogbakuba market experienced engine failure shortly after take-off, resulting in a crash against the bridge's barriers.

WEEKLY SUMMARY ALERT

KIDNAPPING

- The Kibaku Area Development Association (KADA), also known as the Chibok Community, has condemned the neglect of the over 100 schoolgirls kidnapped in 2014. The community said the release of the remaining Abuja-Kaduna train attack victims showed clearly that the government had abandoned Chibok community including their children that were abducted in the secondary school Chibok. The cry came after the secretary of the Chief of Defense Staff Action Committee (CDSAC) announced that all 23 remaining passengers kidnapped from a Kaduna-bound train on March 28, 2022, had been released by their kidnapers.
- Unknown gunmen kidnapped a police officer in Ilorin, the capital of Kwara State. The officer, an Assistant Superintendent of Police (ASP), was kidnapped on Tuesday night as he was about to enter his house in Ogidi, on the outskirts of Ilorin, according to reports. It was learned that police officers have begun a heavy patrol of the Ogidi community and its environs in an effort to apprehend the suspected kidnapers and secure the release of their colleague.
- Eighteen passengers were reportedly abducted by suspected gunmen on Tuesday near the Omerelu community axis of the Port Harcourt-Owerri road in Rivers State's Ikwerre Local Government Area. According to a source, the 18-seater commercial bus was traveling from Imo State to Rivers State when it was attacked. It was also reported that the gunmen shot the bus driver in the leg while the passengers were marched into the bush.
- At least one person was killed when men suspected of being kidnapers stormed Gana Street in Abuja's Maitama neighborhood. The incident occurred at approximately 8:46 p.m. on Wednesday according to reports. According to a resident, the victim was killed while attempting to rescue a man who was being forced into a black Prado SUV by the suspected kidnapers. According to the source, the suspects fled with their victim, while the deceased's body was left on the street

SHOOTING (GUNMEN)

- Unknown gunmen assassinated an Ebubeagu Security Organisation operative in Ezza North local government area of Ebonyi State. The incident was confirmed by the security outfit's state sector commander, who expressed concern about the continuous attack and killing of command personnel in the state by unknown gunmen. According to reports, the incident at Umuezekoha, in the Ezza North local government area of the state, occurred shortly after another personnel was killed by unknown gunmen in Iboko, in the Izzi local government area of the state.
- Three vigilante operatives were killed by gunmen operating in the Igboukwu community of Anambra State's Aguata Local Government Area. According to reports, the leader of the community's vigilante group and two of his men were unwinding in a bar on Wednesday when they were shot. According to a source, the gunmen arrived in a vehicle and opened fire on the operatives who were not battle-ready at the time. The state police spokesman confirmed the incident, saying that operations have been launched to apprehend the attackers, and that surveillance in the area has been increased.
- On Wednesday, suspected herders killed five people in Yelwata, Guma Local Government Area. According to a resident, the hoodlums stormed the community around 1 p.m. on Wednesday and shot at people on their farms. The resident confirmed that they used guns and machetes to attack several people working on their farms. According to reports, the herders fled into the bush as soon as they wreaked havoc.

WEEKLY SUMMARY ALERT

ALERTS DATE: 14th October, 2022

KIDNAPPING

- The Plateau State Police said they had foiled plans by suspected kidnappers to ambush innocent citizens on a bypass road along Du community in Jos South LGA of the state. The police added that during the incident, one of the suspects was killed in a gunfight while the others managed to flee with gunshot wounds.
- One suspect has been detained by Nigerian Police Force agents in connection with the alleged robbery, kidnapping, and murder that occurred on Gana Street in Maitama, Abuja, on Wednesday night. According to the FCT Police Public Relations Office (PPRO), the suspect was apprehended on Thursday following a relentless manhunt and an all-night chase. The vehicle was recovered at Jabi Magajipi, off EcoBank Junction in Abuja's Jabi area, where a resident of Jabi and a suspected member of the criminal syndicate was arrested, she added.
- Residents of three communities in the Alagbado area of Ilorin, Kwara State's capital, have fled their homes as a result of the ongoing kidnappings. The Alagbado communities that have recently been targeted by suspected kidnappers are Aseyori, Alubarika, and Aleniboro phases II and III, which are all located behind the popular Sobi Specialist Hospital in Alagbado, Okelele, Ilorin. According to reports, two residents of the areas were tracked down to their homes and killed by suspected kidnappers while attempting to save their children.

BANDITRY

- The Kaduna State Police Command said on Wednesday that the killing of two bandits and recovery of one AK47 rifle and live ammunition marked another tactical milestone in the state's relentless onslaught against criminal elements. According to a statement released on Thursday by the State Police Command's spokesperson, the Command immediately mobilized a nearby crack squad to advance to the location in an effort to thwart their nefarious mission after receiving an intelligence report. As soon as they arrived, the tenacious officers engaged the bandits in a fierce gun battle, killing two of them while others escaped with varying degrees of bullet wounds.
- Following the resurgence of bandit attacks on communities, the Zamfara Government declared a total lockdown in Anka, Bukkuyum, and Gummi Local Government Areas (LGAs) on Friday. The Commissioner for Information issued a statement on Friday in Gusau announcing the lockdown. The government declares a state of emergency in nine major cities in order to halt the wave of attacks on such communities in the affected areas. These are the towns of Yarkofoji, Birnin Tudu, Rini, Gora Namaye, Janbako, Faru, Kaya, Boko, and Mada.
- Terrorists attacked Gidan Baushe, Gatakawa village in Katsina State's Kankara Local Government Area on Wednesday, killing two residents. The police, on the other hand, rescued 18 residents who had been kidnapped by the terrorists. On October 12, 2022, around 1am, a distress call was received that terrorists in their numbers on motorcycles shot sporadically with AK-47 rifles and attacked Baushe, Gatakawa village, Kankara Local Government Area, according to the state police command's spokesman, who confirmed the incident in a statement on Thursday. Following receipt of the report, DPO Kankara division dispatched tactical units to the area and engaged the hoodlums in a gun battle. The team was successful in driving the terrorists away from their heinous mission and rescuing all of the kidnapped victims.

WEEKLY SUMMARY ALERT

BANDITRY

- During a fierce gun battle with the police on Wednesday in Idasso area of Kidandan in Giwa Local Government Area of Kaduna State, two bandits were neutralized while others were said to have escaped with varying degrees of bullet wounds. During the incident, the police also rescued an unharmed kidnap victim. The state Police Command's spokesman revealed this in a statement issued on Thursday in Kaduna.
- A vigilante official was killed by gunmen suspected of being bandits in Rimawa village, Goronyo Local Government Area, Sokoto state. They also injured one other person before kidnapping the 18-year-old son of the Sokoto state House of Assembly member representing Goronyo Constituency. While confirming the attack, the Chairman of the local government area stated that the bandits invaded the village around 4pm on Wednesday.

SHOOTING (GUNMEN)

- On Thursday night, gunmen invaded the Obeagu community in Ebonyi State's Ishielu Local Government Area, kidnapping an unknown number of people. According to reports, on March 29, 2021, suspected herdsmen invaded the community and killed 17 people. According to community sources, the invaders who laid siege along the community's only access road abducted people returning home on Thursday night.


INSECURITY

- The governor of Benue State yesterday gave the federal government a month to approve the state's request to buy AK-47 rifles for members of its vigilante group, or the state would take appropriate action. Following the killing of farmers in the state by herdsmen, the state government requested such approval from the federal government, but the Presidency insisted that no state of the federation had the authority to acquire such weapons.
- The recent killings in Taraba State have sparked conflict between the community and the state chapter of the Fulani socio-cultural association, Tabital Pulaaku International. On October 2, 2022, vigilante groups killed at least 12 people in Zudai village, near the Dogon-Ruwa community in Taraba State's Bali Local Government Area. While community members claimed that the victims were bandits, the Fulani socio-cultural association claimed that they were innocent of the crimes that led to their deaths at the hands of local vigilante groups.


- As Nigeria records 2,187 cases of cholera in 31 states with 233 deaths in nine months, the Nigeria Center for Disease Control (NCDC) has warned that the country would continue to be at risk of cholera outbreaks along with the associated suffering and deaths unless there is improved access to potable water, sanitation and hygiene. The NCDC's director-general, who issued the warning in a public health advisory on Thursday, emphasized that medical interventions alone were insufficient to address the underlying causes of disease outbreaks.


