DAILY SUMMARY ALERT

ALERTS DATE

The following section illustrates the date alerts were reported on Thursday, 10th November, 2022.

BANDITRY

- Two people were killed yesterday by bandits who attacked Kaffin Koro town in Niger State's Paikoro local government area. It was reported that, in addition to those killed, at least twenty others were shot while the Community was being sacked. The bandits, it was gathered, stormed the town in the afternoon on motorcycles with no fewer than three people on the motorcycles and fully armed. The arrival of the bandits in town caused much confusion and panic as they began shooting sporadically, forcing the people to flee for their lives.
- Between Monday and Wednesday, bandits stole dozens of cattle and food items from farming communities in Tashan Jirgi, Akare, and adjoining villages in Niger State's Wushishi Local Government Area. According to a source, the majority of the residents have fled to Wushishi for safety in order to avoid being kidnapped. According to reports, the constant cattle rustling had severely reduced the supply of cattle to major markets in the area.

KIDNAPPING

- The Nigerian Army has stated that during a search and rescue mission for abducted Staff, its troops neutralized three suspected Indigenous People of Biafra (IPOB)/Eastern Security Network (ESN) members and recovered some weapons. In a statement issued on Wednesday, the director of Army Public Relations stated that one soldier paid the ultimate price during the clash. The Nigerian Army, according to the director of Army Public Relations, will leave no stone unturned in its search for the abducted soldier.
- Six kidnapped college students have described how the Ondo State Security unit, code-named Amotekun, freed them at Ikaramu in the Akoko North West Local Council of the state. They were abducted and held captive for four days in a dense forest before being rescued by Amotekun personnel. The victims-three men and three women-were being transported from Lagos to Abuja when they were kidnapped by eight gunmen. One of the victims alleged that one of the kidnappers was the driver of the commercial vehicle they boarded. According to the state Commander of Amotekun, some people were apprehended in response to a distress call. We obtained their location, which indicated that they were in the vicinity of Akoko. We were there for nearly two days, piling on the pressure. We had to do a lot of tracking to find them

SHOOTING (GUNMEN)

- Two people were killed and several others were injured after a clash between herders and farmers in Kano State's Minjibir LGA. Approximately ten villages have also been sacked and farmlands have been destroyed as a result of the conflict. According to witnesses, the incident began over the weekend when herders allegedly released their animals to graze in farms where crops had yet to be harvested. Daurawa, Kuka Bakwai, Geza, Macinawa, and Kasakore were among the villages attacked, according to reports.
- On Tuesday at 9.30 p.m., gunmen suspected to be Fulani militia allegedly killed three people and destroyed property worth millions of naira in Plateau State's Makabati Batura District, Bokkos Local Government Area. A resident who narrowly escaped said the gunmen attacked residents from the back of a hill, molested some who were caught off guard, and humiliated them in various ways. He claimed that the gunmen who besieged the village killed a woman, her son, and another man.

DAILY SUMMARY ALERT

INSECURITY

- The Inspector-General of Police, announced yesterday that the Force had purchased three high-powered Unmanned Aerial Vehicles (UAVs) for enhanced armed surveillance operations to combat criminal activity in the country. He ordered a total clampdown on non-state actors and criminals in Nigeria. He stated that the drones would aid in the monitoring of active crime scenes, the coordination of response operations, and the provision of armed aerial support to officers on reconnaissance missions.

COMMUNAL CLASH

- About 28 people were killed in some communities in Benue State's Ado local government area. The clannish crisis was said to have started in Ebonyi state but spread to Benue communities, killing 28 people, the majority of whom were women and children. The crisis began when a group of people in the Ebonyi community, enraged by the desecration of their shrine, decided to unleash terror on Benue communities, according to the chairman of the local government, who revealed this on Wednesday.

POLITICS

- The Peoples Democratic Party (PDP) presidential candidate was reportedly attacked and shot-at while attending a campaign rally in Maiduguri, the capital of Borno State, on Wednesday. This claim has been refuted by the Borno State Police Command. Through the Police Public Relations Officer (PPRO), the State Commissioner of Police rebutted the news report, calling it fake, false, and malicious information spread, especially on social media, by some unscrupulous elements.

HOODLUMS

- Some suspected hoodlums have set fire to an Independent National Electoral Commission (INEC) office in Abeokuta, Ogun State's capital. According to reports, the hoodlums scaled the perimeter fence, jumped into the premises, and set fire to the INEC building from the back. According to reports, the facility's security guard called the police in a panic at around 1 a.m., claiming that the building was on fire. It was gathered that the store, the Registration Area Officer's office and the conference room were affected by the inferno.




